Events take place during the month of March in Albuquerque and Santa Fe – to coincide with Women's History Month. There are more than 60 presentations, performances, art exhibitions/installations, workshops, classes, cinema, demonstrations, interactive events, and other examples of women (and men) working across the creative fields.
